This year for AC&C, we are at the Sheraton Framingham Hotel & Conference Center in Framingham MA. Everything is included in the same building! The room rate is \$149/night plus 11.7% state and local taxes (total = \$166.43/night) for both the King and Double-Double rooms. Suites have an extra cost. This includes on-site parking and Wi-Fi.

#### A few things to note:

- All Harmony, Inc. members attending AC&C must have their name on a convention hotel reservation, per Area 2 policy, to avoid paying the Fair Share Assessment Fee (one night's hotel room cost) before they can pick up their AEP.
- Please ensure, when booking your room that the names of all roommates are included in the reservation.
- Whenever possible, make sure the name on the room matches the name on your AEP.
- Our Room block and convention rate are in effect until 5 p.m. on March 13, 2024. After that date, the convention rate and rooms may not be available.
- The check-in time is 3 p.m. The check-out time is 12 p.m.
- Please do NOT book your room with hotel points, as your room will not be in our hotel block or count towards our required number of contracted rooms.

- Under "Room Requests and Availability," you may expand it to make requests about your room. These are not guaranteed.
- Uncheck any boxes you do not want to for Marriott Bonvoy.
- Select "Book Now."
- Any additional guests will need to be added to your reservation by emailing Kristen Try at <a href="mktry@colwenhotels.com">mktry@colwenhotels.com</a> (faster option) or by calling Kristen at 508-270-1954 (you may need to leave a message). You will need to give her your name, arrival date and your roommate names(s).

Aaron Evans – Aaron is an active judge and coach for quartets and choruses throughout the Barbershop Harmony Society. He currently serves on the music team of the Music City Chorus and is a certified Singing Judge. Aaron has performed in vocal and instrumental groups since the age of 4. He loves sharing his passion for music and finding ways to make music accessible to all learners and performers. Aaron earned his undergraduate degrees in music education, jazz composition and trumpet performance from Ithaca College in Ithaca, New York. He also earned his Master's degree in Conducting from Central Michigan University. He served as a high school teacher for 19 years before his retirement from full time teaching. He currently is semi-retired and enjoys refurbishing old homes, flying airplanes and he resides in Columbia, Tennessee with his greyhounds Nala and Lincoln.

Andrew Lujan – Andrew started singing barbershop as a young student and hopes to positively impact the lives of singers through barbershop singing and education. He earned a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from Florida International University in 2019 and went on to teach grades K-5 for three years in the South Florida area before moving to the Greater Boston area. In addition, Andrew has extensive experience studying and teaching voice. He currently serves as a certified Singing Judge in the Barbershop Harmony Society and as the Vice President of Youth in Harmony for the BHS Northeastern District. Lastly, he enjoys singing with his fiancée in Voices United (chorus) and singing with his best friends in Wildfire (quartet).

Angie Dolber - Angie is originally from Adams, Massachusetts. She has been in Harmony, Inc. since 2000 starting with The Barre-Tones, Inc. chorus in Vermont for two years, and then became a member of Women of Note in Hudson, MA when she moved back to Massachusetts in 2002 to marry her current husband, John, residing in Whitinsville. Anne is a retired Sales and Marketing Executive and lives in Harleysville, Pennsylvania with her husband, Ig Jakovac, who is a retired business executive and the current BHS Singing Category Specialist. Between their busy schedules of coaching, directing, judging and singing, Anne and Ig enjoy La Pura Vida in Costa Rica with family during the colder winter months.

A 44' wide x 24' deep, raised stage (24" off the floor) will be built and sound equipment will be brought in to the Grand Ballroom.


Please note that there will be no curtain for the chorus contest. There will be a background drape for both contests. There will be an entry ramp on stage right and stairs to exit on stage left. All choruses will use the ramp to enter the stage and will exit using the stairs. Individuals needing to use the ramp to exit may do so. Quartet entry and exit to and from the stage may be from either side.

The Stage Manager will not touch any motorized mobility devices brought to the backstage area. Each chapter is responsible for providing an escort on/off the stage for any person using a mobility device, if needed.

There will be eight 4' four-step risers for the chorus contest. The detailed stage dimensions are as follows:
